Yummy Gooey Chocolate Brownies

This recipe is yummy, gooey and delicious! Who would not want to miss out on these delicious chocolate snacks and puddings!

Ingredients:

- 185g unsalted butter
- 185g dark cooking chocolate
- 85g plain flour
- 40g cocoa powder
- 3 large eggs
- 275g caster sugar (golden caster sugar is even better)

You also need a 20_{cm} square tin

Oven Temperature: 180°c Time: 30-35 minutes

- 1. Melt the butter and chocolate in a bowl over a pan of hot water until completely melted. Let it cool by taking off the pan and leave it on the side.
- 2. While it is melting, whisk the eggs and sugar in a medium sized bowl. It should double in size and be a milkshake consistency.
- 3. Pour the cooled chocolate mixture over the eggy mixture and fold with a metal spoon.
- 4. Sieve over the flour and cocoa powder and fold in until fudge like. Stop before you want to.
- 5. Pour into the greased and lined tin and cook for 30-35_{mins}. In the end you will get a fudgy, yummy delicious set of brownies. YUMMY!


